On behalf of the National Eucharistic Congress Team, thank you for your participation in the 10th National Eucharistic Congress through the Marian Pilgrim Statue processions spearheaded by the Marian Devotional Movement in Canada and the Blue Army here in the United States.

The pilgrim statue processions of Our Lady of the Cape and Our Lady of Fatima to Indianapolis in 2024 will visibly demonstrate Our Blessed Mother's accompaniment of this Eucharistic Revival journey the Church is undertaking collectively.
